HEELING YOUR CHIHUAHUA By Vera Van Verst

Training your puppy to heel requires patience. In this exercise I will try to explain some techniques to heel your Chihuahua. First, hold the leash in your hand and let your puppy walk freely while you follow it. After doing this a few times, pat the left side of your leg (you may have to pat the lower part of your leg to get your dog's attention) then follow with good boy/girl every 4 or 5 steps. If your dog starts to pull, stand still, wait until your dog turns toward you, then call him/her up to your side again, and walk the other way. You may have to repeat this procedure a few times. After practicing this use a release work like, 'okay', then praise him/her and give a treat.

After about a week of getting your dog to come up next to you, site your dog on your left side, say the word, 'heel', and step off with your left foot. You can use a treat or a toy in your left hand to coax your dog to keep up with you. Then take a few steps, stop, and tell him/her to 'sit'. Repeat these steps followed with a treat or praise. Your dog will always have a happy outlook when learning with positive reinforcement.

Every dog has their own personality. Some dogs require more help than others. Obedience classes are a good place to get individual and social experiences for your dog.

TASTY TREATS

Chips' First Birthday Cake
3 lbs. turkey or chicken, ground
3 egg whites; or 2 whole eggs
1 1/2 cups oatmeal
1/4 cup parsley, minced
1 t garlic powder

Mix all ingredients thoroughly. Mold into desired shape (a bone shape is good). Bake at 350 degrees in broiler pan or on rack to drain fat, for 45 minutes to 1 hour, 15 minutes, depending on thickness of loaf. Remove from



oven, cool, and place on a plate. May be "frosted" " with low-fat cream cheese
