

#### CRUFTS 2000!!!!BIGGEST DOG SHOW ON EARTH By Vera Van Verst

AN EYEWITNESS ACCOUNT:

I didn't know what to expect when we set out to the Crufts Dog Show in Birmingham, England.

I heard it was the biggest dog show in England, but when we got there it was much more than I expected.

Imagine 5 auditoriums equal to or bigger than a football field with about 400 booths of vendors and various clubs and organizations involving dogs. In one auditorium there was a stadium type ring in a small section called the Main Ring where the Best of Breed and Special Activities competition like obedience, agility, and flyball is the center of attraction. These events were all televised throughout the NEC (National Exhibitions Center) for everyone to see. There were also 34 rings and over 5,000 dogs to show. Every dog was beautiful, of course. What I was also amazed by was how these dogs all got along together. They had the best temperament, even the Chihuahuas.

There were 178 Chihuahuas entered, which took nearly the whole day to show. But, one longcoat and one smoothcoat were chosen for the final selection for the Toy Breeds Group ring. So these were considered the best for it's breed out of the 178 entries. It must have been a hard choice to make.

Next year's show is expected to be even bigger because they are allowing dogs in from other countries to enter.

#### Recipe by Lee Ann Lee GROOVY BOUVIE BROWNIES

**INGREDIENTS:** 

1 Pound raw liver 4-5 cloves garlic 2 cup rice flour 1 egg

Mix in food processor until smooth or in batches in blender. Lightly oil a jelly roll pan and dust with cornmeal or raw oats. Press liver mixture onto pan using moistened hands. Depending on the liver, may need more or less flour. Dough should be similar to a muffin or biscuit mix in consistency. Bake 350 degrees for 20 - 30 minutes. Biscuits will continue to harden after removing from oven. Cut into desired shapes or pieces. Very simple and dogs love them. Wonderful for training treats, strips tear into tiny morsels for quick rewards. Keep refrigerated.

# Book Review by Teresa Lee War Dogs: A History of Loyalty and Heroism, Michael G. Lemish.

Throughout history dogs have been employed by the military for combat duty, but there is little written about these 'forgotten veterans' of war except for a line or two imbedded in a few military books or magazine articles.

In **War Dogs: A History of Loyalty and Heroism**, Michael Lemish provides a very insightful book that delves into the history of dogs in the military. The book is chronologically organized, starting with the origins of the modern military working dog, and goes through each of the wars in the 20<sup>th</sup> century and examines the role dogs played in the wars.

Lemish looks at how the military, as an establishment, treats such dogs, but also includes the GI's personal experience with the dogs as handlers. Photographs in the books provides evidence that these handlers did not necessarily treat them as did the establishment, but bonded with their canine companions on an emotional level as well.

This book is a tribute to those canine soldiers who served, often at the expense of their own lives, and much of the information on this part of military history is being told for the first time.
