The Chihuahua club of Hawaii is connected to the Hawaiian Humane Society. If a Chihuahua passes through the adoption process and will be put to death the HS would contact us and we would send someone out to adopt the dog. Basically we would have to pay the same adoption fee even though we are rescuing it from being put down. We would find it a home and would ask for the same amount as a donation. I have been informed by the Society that it is extremely rare for small dogs to not be adopted. They usually are the first to find homes. Because of this we have yet to have a rescue case on our hands through the HS. However, I came across a Chi baby once with broken legs and I got the pet store to give it to me so I could find it a good home. The pup went to a Veterinarian family who fixed the legs. If a situation arises where a Chihuahua needs to be rescued from a situation, we need members who would foster that dog for the few days it would take to find it a permanent home.
