1 box Duncan Hines	8 oz. Cream cheese
Devil's food cake mix	
1 pkg. Vanilla Instant	½ cup sugar
Pudding	
½ cup oil	4 eggs
6 oz. Chocolate chips	1 cup water

Beat and set aside the cream cheese, ½ cup sugar, and 1 egg.

Beat for 2 minutes on medium speed, 1 box cake mix, 1 pkg, vanilla pudding, 3 eggs, ½ cup oil, 1 cup water. Line 9 x 13 inch pan with waxed paper. Pour ½ cup cake mix batter in pan. Add the cream cheese mixture over batter evenly. Then add the rest of the cake batter. Sprinkle chocolate chips over the top. Bake at 325 degrees for 40-45 minutes.
