## Chihuahua Rescue and Adoptions By Tracy Lehmann

The Chihuahua Club of Hawaii is connected to the Hawaiian Humane Society. If a Chihuahua passes through the adoption process and will be put to death the HS would contact us and we would send someone out to adopt the dog. Basically we would have to pay the same adoption fee even though we are rescuing it from being put down. We would find it a home and would ask for the same amount as a donation. I have been informed by the Society that it is extremely rare for small dogs to not be adopted. They usually are the first to find homes. Because of this we have yet to have a rescue case on our hands through the HS. If a situation arises where a Chihuahua needs to be rescued from a situation, we need members who would foster that dog for the few days it would take to find it a permanent home. Please contact us if you are willing to do this. Please consider being a foster home since it would be just for a short period of time.

The Club is also contacted by people looking to adopt a Chihuahua or looking for a new home for their Chihuahua. The Club is willing to help the owner look for a new home, however, the original owner must disclose all health problems being experienced by the Chihuahua, and the reason for putting the dog up for

adoption. Medical records may be required by the Club to assist us in placing the dog with the right person.

## Advertisements to Place Chihuahuas and Referral Policy

The Club receives a great number of calls from people outside and within the club asking for information on where they can get a Chihuahua. To answer these inquiries, the Club will only give out the names and phone numbers of breeders and others in the club that have an advertisement in the club newsletter and website.

The fees will help to defray the cost of printing our Club newsletter, and to pay for the website provider. All persons advertising must be members in good standing in the Club and with the American Kennel Club. The Club does not endorse any particular breeder or advertiser in the newsletter or on the website. The Club reserves the right to pull any ad at any time and for any reason. If an ad is pulled by the Club, the fee will be pro-rated and the remainder returned. All club members may freely give out this advertising information to the public.

We also feel that breeders should make every effort to ensure that every puppy sold is healthy, both genetically healthy, and healthy meaning without canine diseases or illness, and without temperament problems. And any older adult that is advertised for placement or sale must also be healthy or the health problem must be stated in the ad.

The Club can also provide some information/handouts on things to consider when getting a pup. This information is available upon request and on our website under Chihuahua Information.

# Club Policy on Vendors For Products, Toys, etc.

In the past, club members and outside vendors have approached the club inquiring whether they can sell their goods at our meetings, or at the Hawaii Pet Expo and similar events or advertise on our website and newsletters.

Vendors (both members and non members) may sell their goods at club meetings. This must be arranged before hand since not all meeting locations allow commercial exchanges. The club will ask vendors for at least a 10% discount on all merchandise being sold to its members.

For the Hawaii Pet Expo and other similar events. our proposed policy will lbe that if there are any vendors that are interested in joining us, the club will rent a large (20; x 10') booth. The club will use half the area (10; x 10') for its activities and the remaining 10; x 10' area will be used and paid for by the vendor(s). In addition, the vendor(s) will pay the club an additional \$50 donation, and a written agreement is required. Subletting of the vendor's portion of the booth will not be permitted. The donation and the cost of the vendors' portion of the booth must be submitted prior to the time that the club must submit our application for the booth for the event. If there are no vendors who submit the fee and donation prior to the application deadline, vendors will NOT be allowed in the club booth since the club will be getting the smaller booth.

For our website and newsletter advertising we would allow an ad, provided the Club receives a donation of product(s) to pay for the ad. The products will be used as prizes for Club activities or raffle prizes. A 10% discount to club members will also be required. See example below.
