Do You Wish to Train Your Chihuahua?

There are several training courses around the Island of Oahu that might suit your schedule and needs. Registration for these courses are soon or upon us, and if you would like to sign up for a course you might have to hurry. Most obedience classes require proof of DHL & Parvo shots.

Progressive Dog Training at the Neal Blaisdell Park. The park is located in Aiea, one block ewa of Cutter Ford and across the street from Burger King on Kamehameha Highway. Turn into the park at the Kaahumanu Street intersection. Classes begin promptly at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday mornings, unless otherwise notified. Classes are available at all regular levels of obedience training: Kindergarten Puppy Training (KPT), Basic Novice, Advance Novice, Open, and Utility. This year they will also have a new Conformation Class at 10:30 am on Saturdays. Registration is January 4 and 11, 2003 at the park. Email Jean at Jeansampaio@hawaii.rr.com for more information.

Art's Obedience at Heeia Neighborhood Park on Wednesday evenings and Newtown Park on Sunday mornings. Registration for Wednesday classes are Jan. 8 & 15 and classes begin Jan. 22. Chihuahua Club of America Constitution

SECTION 1. The name of the Club shall be The Chihuahua Club of America, Inc.

SECTION 2. The objectives of the Club shall be:

- (a) to encourage and promote quality in the breeding of pure-bred Chihuahuas and to do all possible to bring their natural qualities to perfection;
- (b) to encourage the organization of independent local Chihuahua Specialty Clubs in those localities where there are sufficient fanciers of the breed to meet the requirements of the American Kennel Club:
- (c) to urge members and breeders to accept the standard of the breed as approved by the American Kennel Club as the only standard of excellence by which Chihuahuas shall be judged;
- (d) to do all in its power to protect and advance the interests of the breed and to encourage sportsmanlike competition at dog shows and obedience trials;
- (e) to conduct sanctioned matches, specialty shows, and obedience trials under the rules of the American Kennel Club:
- (f) to promote the qualities of the Chihuahua breed to the members and general public through publications, educational seminars, library data bank, etc.

SECTION 3. The Club shall not be conducted or operated for profit and no part of any profits or remainder or residue from dues or donations to the Club shall inure to the benefit of any member or individual.

SECTION 4. The members of the Club shall adopt and may from time to time revise such by-laws as may be required to carry out these objectives.

CODE OF ETHICS

As a member of the Chihuahua Club of America, I pledge to uphold the goals of the Club as set forth in the Club's Constitution and By-laws, to encourage good sportsmanship in the sport of dogs, and to set an example of honorable kennel business practices when dealing with any person.

Specifically, I further pledge:

To uphold the American Kennel Club rules applying to Dog Shows and Registration, particularly as regards to the maintenance of complete and accurate breeding records.

To accept and uphold the Standard of the Chihuahua as developed by the Chihuahua Club

of America and approved by the American Kennel Club.

To breed only AKC registered Chihuahuas (does not apply to foreign members) with the aim of maintaining or improving the qualities of the breed as set forth in the Standard, and not for personal gain. I will never knowingly sell puppies to wholesalers, laboratories or to pet stores, and will encourage any puppy buyer to behave similarly.

To serve as an example of good sportsmanship in every aspect of the sport of dogs, and to assist and befriend newcomers and novices to the best of my ability.

To keep myself informed in the areas of dog health and genetics and to carefully screen all breeding stock for hereditary faults or disqualifying defects, removing any questionable animals from my breeding program.

To conduct all my kennel practices in a clear, honorable and open fashion, and to use written agreements or contracts whenever possible.
